
Hyperangulated Blade Technique




1 Insert the blade midline, advancing the tip until it is past the posterior aspect of the tongue.




3 Using a GlideRite stylet (optional), introduce the ET tube along the right side the blade.




5 To remove the GlideRite stylet, pull it out towards the patient's feet.



2 Identify the epiglottis and advance the blade into the vallecula for a view of the glottis.



4 Complete the intubation.
